

Since the Bluebills were formed we have had many deserving Bluebills who have been honored as "Bluebill Volunteer of the Year" for their contributions to their communities.

Every one of you who volunteer has a significant contribution to your community and over the years we have recorded your volunteer hours.

This is very important to us as it conveys to the Boeing Company that its support to our organization is more than justified.

I have done a little research and since 2004 up to June 30th of this year all our Bluebills Chapters have recorded 735,576 volunteer hours. The records I have for Heritage Chapter are from 2007 up to June 30th 2012 and these hours are 308,928. You can see that the Bluebills contribution is considerable and at around \$20/hr is worth about \$14.7 million. Heritage Chapter's share is \$6.2 million.

This is an achievement to be proud of so keep sending in those volunteer hours.

There are 2 openings in this area:

Meals on Wheels Driver/Delivery – Volunteers are needed to deliver food to Meals on Wheels clients within the Tukwila City limits. Volunteer must accept payments from clients. Volunteers must use private vehicle and record mileage for reimbursement from City. Meals must be delivered on Thursday mornings between 9:00-11:00 A.M. Volunteer must be reliable, trustworthy and have a good driving record. This position can be done by one volunteer, two volunteers or a team of volunteers. Volunteers work in this position year-round, so the program would be interested in a long term commitment.

Van and Shuttle Bus Driver – Volunteers are needed to drive participants to Parks & Recreation scheduled programs and activities for a variety of age groups (youth, teen and seniors). They are specifically looking for drivers with a CDL endorsement to drive the 21 passenger shuttle bus, but volunteer drivers are also needed for 15 passenger vans. All drivers must have excellent driving records; Shuttle bus drivers must have a CDL endorsement. The hours are flexible – need varies by month (and program registration). Programs mostly occur weekdays (day or evening); occasional weekend work too. Volunteers must be reliable, trustworthy and have a good driving record. This position can be done by one volunteer, two volunteers or a team of volunteers. Volunteers are needed year round to support the program.

- Nominations should be one page long, either typed or printed.
- Please include your name, address, telephone number, signature and date. Anonymous nominations will not be accepted.
- Nominations must be received no later than October 23, 2012.
- Nominee must be a Heritage Chapter Boeing retiree or his/her spouse.
- Nominee should be informed of his/her nomination, but this is optional.
- Self-nominations are encouraged.
- Nominee's efforts must be performed as a non-paid volunteer.
- Bluebills reserve the right to use all nominees' names and achievement records in news stories and feature articles at a later date, whether or not the nominee wins.
- Agencies, organizations or projects with which the nominee has volunteered will be contacted to verify nomination information.
- Emphasis will be placed on the period from September 1, 2011 to October 1, 2012.

The Volunteer of the Year dinner will be held on November 6, 2012, and you will soon receive a letter with information and a form to be used to make your reservations for the dinner.
