PENINSULA SUPPORT ORGANIZATION (PSO) Operating as Bluebills TREASURER'S REPORT 1st Quarter 2022

This report is for the period January thru March 2022. We have \$41,172.07 in cash, net of uncashed checks. That is an increase of \$3,386.90. Much of that increase is due to donations made in memory of Myron Vogt.

Here is the breakdown by Fund:

Unrestricted fund

The increase is due to receiving several donations made in memory of Myron Vogt.

STEM fund

A donation of \$1000 in memory of Myron Vogt was received.

Builders fund

The decrease is due to the cost of the builders' warehouse, \$420, for the Quarter exceeded donations received. The storage facility raised its rates \$10/month

Kitsap Builders Fund

The increase is due to the Kitsap Builders program receiving \$2353 in donations from private donors during the quarter. Their donations exceeded expenses for material of \$1210.

Thanks to Tom Sprandel, the internet guy, donors can make donations to PSO / Bluebills via the Web. Since setting up this process early in the year, PSO has received just under \$1000 via Square One which is the App behind the donation page on our website. The convenience does come at a cost, almost 3% of the transaction is lost to the credit card providers. We are still glad to take checks, sent to the new PO Box I set up this quarter.

I have also been in contact with Kitsap Bank about setting up a process to enable PSO to accept stock donations. The internal workings of a bank grind slowly. No success yet.

Ramp Relocated

Two years ago we would have estimated the material cost of this 32' ramp as somewhere around \$950. Today it would be closer to \$1,600. For the South Kitsap veteran who was ready to be released from rehab but could not come home until a ramp was in place, the cost was totally out of reach. Fortunately a 24' ramp, that was no longer needed, had just become available.

The Bluebills Independent Living Program Project Handbook cites two methods of constructing ramps. For site-built ramps, nail guns are used for most of the fastening. This is a quick and efficient method of construction. For the modular technique, ramp and platform sections (8-ft nominal lengths) are bolted to the posts using angle brackets and structural screws. Ramps can then be taken apart and removed/relocated when a client moves or no longer needs them.

For the South Kitsap client the additional materials, in order to add an L-shape connection to the porch, would have cost some \$400, which was still out of reach, so the rest of it was scrounged from leftover and surplus materials. The ramp replaced rotted out steps that were in danger of collapse, and repairs were also made to the porch. Then prior to his coming home, kindly neighbors came over and cleaned his house.
