Santa for Seniors

William Looney didn't want any senior to feel forgotten at Christmas. Each year the Tacoma businessman equipped himself with a Santa suit that he would wear to local nursing homes. He brought gifts and made sure residents felt special. The act transformed Looney and inspired him to launch Santa for Seniors through the William A. Looney Family Foundation before he died in 2015.

The foundation's mission is "Remembering the Forgotten," explained Looney's widow Trudy. "Bill wanted to ensure that homebound and nursing home seniors with no nearby family would not be forgotten at Christmas."

Each year the Looney Family Foundation, partnered with Lutheran Community Services Northwest, puts together holiday gift bags for seniors who might otherwise be forgotten at Christmas. Once again Bluebills helped to carry on the tradition, delivering Santa for Seniors bags to our elderly, live-alone clients.

Catholic Community Services notified us of a ramp in Bremerton that was no longer needed and was available for removal and reuse. We had an address, but not the name of the client for whom the ramp was originally built. When we got there we right away remembered. This was a ramp we put in about 4 years ago, and it included a side chute for the dog to get down to the yard. Alas, Banjo and his owner have both passed away.

It took just under an hour take apart. The ramp modules, posts, and railing assemblies have already been earmarked for a low-income client in South Kitsap.


