2021 OUTLOOK AND PLANS

South Jefferson County

The South Jefferson branch, Brinnon and Quilcene area, have been able to continue their monthly pickups at World Vision. Builders have been responding as needed. We do need to hold a meeting in that area to recruit, train and recognize member achievements. Probably in June or July.

North Jefferson County

We need to hold recruiting, training and member recognition meetings. Our membership has held up pretty well but there are quite a few new faces.

Clallam County

Health and aging have taken a toll on our Clallam County members. We need to meet with them and figure out a way to get the Builders and World Vision programs going again. Perhaps we need to have some Jefferson County members lend a hand.

Kitsap County

Kitsap activity slowed over the past year with Builders focusing on the most urgent requests. We plan to begin picking up the pace, including working through a backlog of grab bar installations and indoor work. A meeting sometime late spring or early summer will be held for the purpose of making sure the team members know each other, information exchange, new member recruitment and orientation, and leadership development.

We plan to hold a Wine Tasting and a Used Book fund raiser in the fall. Right now, we have a few thousand dollars in the PSO fund to use to help STEM programs.

They both got Master's Degrees from Central Michigan University, in their respective fields. John spent a few years in the army in Arizona and Japan. They were married in 1969.

Sally taught school for 30 years in Michigan and Arizona. John's first job out of college was working in a retail music store where he was part owner. His next job was working for the Yamaha Corporation in the division which made band instruments and drums. He spent 22 years there. They both thought they would like living in the Phoenix area for the rest of their lives. And they did get involved with many volunteer activities down there. They both retired several years ago.

Like so many people in the AZ area, they spent their summers up in the Northwest. For years they had divided their time between a cabin South of Brinnon and Surprise, AZ. Then they decided to sell both their places and find a home here where they could live year-around.

Dangerous Stair Steps

Stairways are a common location for falls, and they result in a disproportionate risk of death or severe injury.

In Bremerton we see many older homes with multiple concrete steps, frequently in disrepair, leading up to or down to the entry. Often the railing has fallen apart, or was never there in the first place. It's one thing to take a fall on a couple of padded stair steps inside the home. It's quite another to fall down a number of concrete steps on the outside.

We recently responded to a request from the daughter-in-law of an elderly man who was recuperating at her home after returning from the hospital following a fall. She reported that he would not be allowed to return to his own home until railings were installed along the two sets of concrete stairs leading to the entrance of his house.

The site survey revealed that both of them were ready for him to return to his independent living. Measurements were taken and Bluebills returned to get the job done.





North Kitsap Ramp

This North Kitsap client suffers ailments that had trapped him in his home. He has Parkinson's Disease which has its own challenges, then he recently fell and broke his femur. His wife was unable to move him up and down the steps, and couldn't get him to doctor's appointments for medical treatment. This ramp will allow her to get him in/out of the house, and they are both grateful.

BLUEBILLS SUPPORT TRI-AREA FOOD BANK IN MANY WAYS

The second Tuesday of each month Bluebills and other volunteers gather at the Tri-Area Food Bank in Chimacum at 8:00 to help unload the monthly shipment of food from the area warehouse. In 2010 twelve Bluebills pitched in on the effort and unloaded 108,000 pounds of goods. That's nearly five tons each month that the crew unloads from the truck, box –by-box, and stores in the food bank.

Bluebills help the food bank wherever we can. Last year the guys built 72 linear feet of shelving to increase the storage capability. The Tri-Area Food Bank is also a member of the Bluebills Gifts-In-Kind Program and, as such, is provided with a list of items they can select and have delivered each quarter. Recently the food banks computer crashed and Bluebills were able to provide them with a workable spare computer.

Ken Snider coordinates our work with the food bank and contact him if you are interested in helping or just show up at the food bank the second Tuesday of the month at 8:00.
