SOUTH JEFFERSON ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES PROGRAM (ESP)

During the past six months the ESP was in a wait state due to the Corona Virus issue and the consequent closure of the World Vision Warehouse in Fife. Deliveries began again two months ago and are now scheduled for monthly pickups for both the North and South Bluebill groups. Pickup service was changed by World Vision to an earlier plan of pallets only, which resulted in much larger quantities of single items. Since then, several changes have been made to reduce the inventory of goods in our warehouse and to share goods with more recipients.

We now distribute our regular item list to our 11 Brinnon/Quilcene recipients first to assure the local priority is maintained. We then develop a "surplus" list for additional distribution outside our regular area. The surplus list is now distributed to Dove House and OLYCAP (Port Townsend) and Hood Canal School (Potlatch) and Mountain View School (Shelton). This requires special deliveries approximately two weeks after our local deliveries. We have also begun a program to define and share surplus items with the Port Ludlow group. These new programs have been met with considerable support from all.



BACK IN BUSINESS (KIND-OF) WITH WORLD VISION

Last March, World Vision basically shut down their Essential Supplies Program. Occasionally they have let us know that we could pick up some items using limited contact with personnel. In August things loosened up a bit and the Southern Jefferson group and our group picked up limited supplies in pallet-sized loads. Our groups have now come to an agreement with World Vision that we can pick up every month. The amount we pickup may be limited by availability and CV restrictions. In any case, we hope we are back on a regular schedule with World Vision. Southern Jefferson Bluebills are negotiating their own schedule.

As of now we will be picking up on the second Tuesday of the month, 9:00 at Fife. At this point we are expecting to be limited to pallets, so we need vehicles capable of handling these.

Our next pickup will be on October 13, 9:00 am at Fife. It will be for Jefferson County. Pick and delivery date TBD. In November we will pick up on Nov 10 for Kitsap Co.

All volunteers who have helped in the past, please stand by to lend a hand again with the duties to make this program work.

I hope we can get back to full operation as we gain experience with this process and CV is gotten under control.




JeffCo Builders Don Abbot, Joe Gagnier, Todd Knoblock and David Parish hit the road last month for a ramp and railing job in Sequim.

Poulsbo Ramp

We built an 8' ramp with platform for a client in Kingston earlier this year. It was one of the last ones we got in prior to the temporary shutdown due to Covid. She recently moved into a new home, just weeks before scheduled surgery. Needless to say, she had a lot of concerns on her mind, including how she would get in/out of the house with her wheelchair.

Bluebills were able to put in a new switchback ramp with days to spare before the hospitalization. Her old ramp was removed and incorporated into the new one. Normally we don't install balusters between the railings, but in this case we made an exception. Michael Crovitz and John White took the lead on this one, with some assistance from Bob Keever.

Pressure treated lumber has become increasingly difficult to obtain in Kitsap. A combination of supply slowdowns and everyone working on home improvement projects seem to be the culprit.

Normally we have Hadlock Lumber deliver direct for the larger ramp jobs, and we are grateful to them for the free delivery out here. For the smaller jobs we maintain a supply of lumber that we can draw from our storage locker, which we recently restocked with a delivery from Hadlock, where the lumber shortage doesn't seem to have hit too hard.



Starting in Oct., I hope to again set up the above lists. Most Jefferson and Clallam job requests seem to come to me so I have the data. Kitsap requests go through Bob Keever, and he maintains much the same data. By 2021 we should be caught up.

I can see from this episode that with my age and health if we want to maintain some kind of Builders record, I can't be counted on too much longer. I would like to see each county keep track of their own jobs which means a Builder Coordinator for each county.

For the past several years Bluebills have been collecting school supplies over the summer months so that we can deliver a significant amount of goods just prior to schools starting in the Fall. **Dick Ostlund** coordinates the effort which requires obtaining a warehouse (in this case a 12 foot by 40 storage unit), shelving for the unit (made by Bluebills with funds provided by

Ken Winter's SON, who is a Boeing airplane salesman.) and sorting out the goods as they are received. The school supplies are provide by World Vision.


By the time of delivery there was no longer any room in the warehouse and the Gifts-In-Kind warehouse was used for overflow.

During the last week in August the items were delivered to the thirteen schools in our area who have more then 70% of the students on free or reduced price meals. The schools stretched from Queets, Neah Bay and Clallam Bay on the west and northwest coast to schools in Shelton, in the Hood Canal.

Our volunteers stepped up to the task of delivering about one pickup truck load of schools supplies to each of the schools. The Hood Canal volunteers took care of the schools in their area. Russ and Shelly Rousseau made the long trip to Queets, dropping off the Forks load in route. Ted Muralt of Clallam Bay arranged for their school district to make their pick up. Amy and John Miller, Mike Graham and Larry Lang covered the


