
This shelf will hold so many therapy toys and be involved in the healing of many children in Chimacum. Thank you for your support for our kids mental well being.

PSO Bluebill Builders: Call for Volunteers

The PSO Bluebills Builders have been serving the community for over 20 years. One very important activity is supporting the Independent Living Program. Modeled after the AARP program, the Builders help identify and correct in-home problems which interfere with or prevent the occupant from performing safely those day-to-day functions necessary for home life.

The Builders install grab bars, railings and ramps. These home improvements guard against falls which can lead to serious injury and immobility. This year the Builders have answered more than 45 requests for grab bars and ramps in the local area between Port Townsend and Port Ludlow. Requests for assistance come in every week. The summer months are the busiest.

A small core of volunteers makes up the current Builders group. Each member can survey the ramp area, design a suitable ramp, according to ADA regulations, and then manage its construction. All ramps are built with the approval of the recipient who is usually present the day of the build. Grab bars are installed in strategic places, where hand holds make for safer transition from sitting to standing, or for stability. After each project is completed, it is rewarding to know that the result means a safer home for the recipient.

The Builders are experiencing a demand that is outpacing builder resources, thus the need for more volunteers. We can use all hands, and the Builders are happy to show newcomers the ropes.
